I do think that wanting to be in the forensic field has something to do with my faith. I want to solve problems and make this world a better place by helping people who solve the crimes get the evidence and information they need. Once I'm settled in my career I definitely want to get married to someone I am in love with and be with him "For as long as I shall live." I would marry someone who makes me laugh, smile, challenges me in a good way and someone who I can share my thoughts, love, interests, and feelings with. I want to have 2 or 3 beautiful kids. I will have them go to a Catholic School to get a great education and learn their faith.

He and his wife set up a home that became famous as a center of learning and where families came to pray and worship God. He made sure that his daughters learned how to read and write, and to know Latin and Greek as well as English. During this time period, it was inappropriate for girls to have an education.
